

## DEMOGRAPHICS

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### Overview

Demographics is the study of the characteristics of human populations. It includes population indicators (e.g., growth, age, and educational levels) as well as economic indicators such as income and employment. Data of this nature is invaluable to governments in planning for service delivery associated with new residential and commercial development and to the business community, as leaders make decisions about market trends, customer demographics and possible future locations and/or expansions.

This section of the *Data Report* will focus on demographic characteristics of Cobb County and the broader Atlanta Region<sup>1</sup>. Within the *Report*, Cobb County data is provided at the jurisdictional<sup>2</sup> and census tract levels.

### Population

Census 2000 data indicates that Cobb County has become an even bigger and more diverse than was established in the 1990 Census, with a 36 percent increase in population during the past 10 years. The 2000 count tallied 607,751 Cobb residents, 160,006 more than in 1990 when the number was 447,745. By comparison, Gwinnett County saw a much more dramatic population increase during the last decade accounting for a 66 percent growth, though its total population of 588,448 still trailed the 600,000 mark. With regard to growth among municipalities within Cobb County, Kennesaw experienced the largest population increase (142 percent) during the last decade, from 8,936 in 1990 to 21,675 in 2000.

### **Population Growth by Race**

Cobb's most notable fluctuation in the 2000 survey may be in its racial breakdown, thereby reflecting a strong move toward diversity. White persons, who comprised 94.6 percent of the population in 1980, now claim 72.4 percent, down from 87.5 percent in 1990. The black population saw an increase of 158 percent during the last decade, rising from 44,154 residents in 1990 to 114,233 in 2000. Black persons now embody nearly 19 percent of Cobb County's population.

Another boom was recorded in the Asian population, which rose 139 percent in the 1990s. In 1980, 1,666 Asians were counted in the Census while the 2000 Census number rose to 18,945, thereby accounting for more than 3 percent of the total population. Another obvious trend toward diversity is reflected in the population of Hispanic residents, with a 400 percent increase since the 1990 Census. During that count, the number of Hispanics was recorded as 9,403 and the Census 2000 recorded 46,964, presently accounting for more than 7 percent of the county's population. Below are the Counties located within the (Atlanta Regional Commission) ARC with totals for the 5 predominant races for years 1980, 1990 and 2000, and the percent change over the last decade.

**Population Growth in Metropolitan Counties and Cobb Municipalities**

As indicated earlier, nearby counties saw dramatic population increases during the 2000 Census count. The population of Paulding County almost doubled, swelling from 41,611 in 1990 to 81,678 in 2000. A more subtle effect was detected in Douglas County, where the numbers rose from 71,120 to 92,174 during those same years and accounting for a 29 percent increase. 2000 totals show Gwinnett County adding more people, 235,538, during the 1990s than any other Georgia county and accounting for a 67 percent overall growth. Fulton came in second with 167,055 new residents, followed by Cobb with 160,006 and DeKalb with 120,028. Listed below are numerous counties from around North Georgia and their population changes from 1950 to present.

## **Housing**

The number of housing units in Cobb County has increased from 113,271 in 1980 to 189,872 in 1990 and 238,725 units in 1999. Declining average household size, a long-term trend that has continued in the 1980s and 1990s, caused the more rapid rate of growth for housing. The majority of housing units in Cobb County in 1999 were single-family units (68.0 percent). Multifamily units account for 30.0 percent of the housing mix. Though metro Atlanta's average rent only increased slightly in the 1990s, it was still well above the national average as indicated in Table 8 below:

Table 9 indicates the increased cost of homeownership in Cobb County and the Atlanta area from 1990 to 2000. As interest rates remained somewhat steady on average throughout the 1990's, metro Atlanta homeowner costs, including mortgage payments, increased only slightly and stayed well below the national average. Some markets, however, especially in the city of Atlanta, saw ownership costs rise significantly.
